A PROCLAMATION.

出来の HERE AS the abundant Goodness of Almighty GOD, the Supream Disposer of All Events; manisested, not only in the figual Successive, which, through the divine Biessing, have attended His Majesty's Arms, in the various Parts of their Destination; and parts of V 製 ticularly in North America: But also in the many Smiles of Providence, and distinguishing Instances of Mercy wherewith the DORD our GOD hath been gracious pleased to Favour our Nation and Land and this Colony, the current Year; justly demand we will be good I be given to the Beneficent Author and Fountain of all the good I bings we have.

BACIE therefore thought at, by and with the Advice of the Council, and at the Wes ure of the Representatives, in General Court Assembled, to appoint, and do hereby appoint Thu flev the Twenty-Seventh Day of November next, to be kept throughout this Colony, as a Day of Public Thanksgiving; exhacting both Ministers and People, with upright wearts and becoming Solemnity to oblerbe the lame, in pracing and magnifying the Name of the LORD for the many Dispensations of his Mercy to us; particularly to: the continuation of the precious Life of our gracious Sobereign in this critical Day: And that SDD hath in such diftinguishing Manner limited upon the British Counsels, Administrations and Arms, which have been Blessed with a series of Aidories leading to important Acquisitions and Conquests in North America: That he who Rules in the Bingdoms of Wen hath hitherto defended the Protestant Cause amidit the Commotions among the Nations of Europe; protected the British Nation and Dominions; preserved both our Sea Coasts and Frontiers from the Enemy, and given hopeful Prospeds of their future Tranquility: That GDD is pleased pet to continue to this Colony our civil and religious privileges, and the Enjoyment of the invaluable Bleslings of the Sospel of Peace; and hath favoured us with such wealth and wlenty as to fill us with food and Gladnels: And for all other Tokens of Ewdnels wherewith the Kather of Mercies his crowned this Pear: by all which he hath exhibited most powerful Arguments of Plaise and Thanksgiving.

The Wise to effer up humble and servent Grapers and Intercessions to Almighty Soo for the Ung's most Excellent Dajesty, their Royal highnesses George Prince of Wales, the princesses Downger of Wales, the Duke, the Princesses and all the Royal Kamily: Chat GOD would fill direct the King's Counsels, succeed his Aegotiations; and gracionsly continue to finite upon, bless, and further prosper and succeed his Arms, and those of his Allies; and bring the present War to such a happy Conclusion, that the protestant Cause the Rights of our Mation, and the future Peace and Security of these Colonies may be effectually Established; and that the saving Knowledge of the LORD may be more abundantly made known among all Nations, and particularly to the heathen in this Land; that all people may Rejoice in the Sodness and Salvations of SOD.
