WILLIAM the Third, by the Grace of God, King of England, Scotland, France and Includ, Defender of the Faith, the Among this Loving Subjects in His Kingdom of England, in the Month Officer Last past, of the Success of his Majesties Arms, and of the Wonderful Preservation of its Sacred Person from the many swicked stagistious Compirates and Contrivances of his Enemies, as we as in the Danger to which his talkets impleased so generously to Expose his Sucred Person, for the Salety of M. his Loving Subjects, I have therefore thought sit, by and with the advice and Consent of his Majesta Council for this Province to appoint Thursday the 22th of April next ensuing, a Solemn day of Canadigiving to Almighty God throughout this Province, for so gracious and signal favours, and to offer up the Prayers at the Throne of Grace, for the Continuing of his Mercy and Loving Kindness to our of Salegn Lord the King, to grant him a long, and happy Life a Victorious and Prosperous Reign in this W. Id, and an Everlasting Crown of Glory in the World to Come.

And all Ministers and Proachers of the Vord of God, and all other Persons whatsoever making and Spiriting within this Province and Dependencies, are hereby required to celeberate and keep the same at their Charches or Publick Meeting houses accordingly, as they will answer the Contrary at their Peril.
