10. May. 1716.




To most Deboutly and Thankfully Acknowledge the great Godnels and Herry of Almighty God, who hath associated its his
potention and Assistance, and given Success to Dur Councils
and Arms, in Huppessing the late Unmatural Revellion, ratice
