A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS the General Affembly, at the Session held at South-Kingstown, on the last Monday in October last, taking into Consideration, that it is highly becoming all States and Governments to make public Acknowledgments, with Thanksgiving, to the Creator and Supreme Governor of the Universe, for all his Mercies, did pass an Act, ordering and directing that Thursday, the First Day of December next, should be observed by the Inhabitants of this State as a Day of public Thanksgiving to Almighty God, for the Enjoyment of the free Exercise of our Rights and Liberties, religious and civil; for the Means of a Christian and liberal Education; for blessing the Labour of our Hands, in giving us to reap plentifully the Fruits of the Earth in their due Season, and for all his other Mercies, particularly during the Year past; and enjoined a strict Observance of the aforesaid Day, for the Purpose aforesaid: And requested me to issue a Proclamation accordingly:

I HAVE THEREFORE thought fit to iffue this Proclamation, to make known the same: And do hereby call upon the Inhabitants of this State, to affemble themselves on the said Day, in their usual Places of public Worship, for the said Purpose; and strictly to observe the same as a Day of solemn and public Thanks-giving to Almighty God, for all his Blessings and Mercies.
