# PROCLAMATION.

### FOR A DAY OF THANKSGIVING.

Theing the indispensible Duty of all Nations, not only to offer up their Supplications to Almighty GOD, the Giver of all Good, for his gracious Assistance in a Time of Distress, but also in a solemn and public Manner to give him Praile for his Goodness in general, and especially for great and signal Interpositious of his Providence in their Behalf: Therefore, taking into consideration the many Instances of Divine Goodness to these States, in the Course of the important Conssist, in which they have been so long engaged—the present happy and promising State of public Affairs and the Events of the War in the Course of the Year now drawing to a close, particularly the Harmony of the public Councils which is so necessary to the Success of the public Cause; the perfect Union and good Understanding which has hitherto substitted between them and their Allies, notwithstanding the artful and unwearied Attempts of the common Enemy to divide them: The Success of the Arms of the United States, and those of their Allies, and the Acknowledgment of their Independence by another European Power, whose Friendship and Commerce must be of great and lasting Advantage to these States: And that while it has pleased Almighty GOD to favour us with such a Degree of Health in our Habitations, he hath remembered Mercy, and visited us with refreshing Showers from Heaven after a severe Drought, and hath abundantly watered the dry and thirtly Earth; and crowned the Year with his Goodness:

DO THEREFORZ, by and with the Advice of the Council appoint, and do hereby appoint THURSDAY the Twenty-Eighth Day of November Instant, (the Day recommended by the Congress to all the States) to be religiously observed as a Day of solomn THANKSGIVING, hereby calling upon Ministers and People of all Denominations in their several Assemblies to offer up their unseigned Thanks to our good and gracious GOD, for all his unmerited Favours, with their humble and tervent Supplications to the divine Majesty, that we may by his Judgments be taught Righteousness, and by his Goodness be led to Repentance; and that we may testify our Gratitude to GOD for his Goodness by a chearful Obedience to his Laws, and by promoting each in his hatton, and by his Influence the practice of true and undefiled Religion, which is the great Foundation of public trosperity and national Happiness.

GIVEN at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Fourth Day of November, in the Year of Our LORD One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-Two, and in the Seventh Year of the Independence of the United States of America.
