HAVE therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of the Council, and at the Defire of the House of Representatives in General Court affembled, to appoint, and do hereby appoint Thursday, the Twenty-fourth Day of November next, to be observed as a Day of Public THANKSCIVING throughout this State; carnefly exhorting Ministers and People of every Demonstration, to affemble for Divine Service, and unite with grateful Hearts, in their thankful Acknowledgements for all the Goodness and loving Kindness of the Lord, in the many and diftinguishing Favours confered upon us: For the Continuation of the Blessings of Peace; the Privileges of the Gospel and Means of Grace; the general Health enjoyed; the plentiful Supplies of the Fruits of the Earth; the Prosperity granted to our Commerce and Fishery; and for all other his enumerable Favours which we enjoy. Also to offer up fervent Supplication to the GOD and Father of Mercies, that it may graciously please him to pardon all our Iniquities; continue to us his manifold Favours; grant Wissom and Integrity to all civil Rulers: Bless his facred Ambassadors, and abundantly succeed the Means of Grace and Means of Education: That it may please him to direct and prosper the Administration of the Federal Government for the greatest Good and Happiness of the Nation; cause the Savages of the Wilderness to be at Peace with a and the Land to have Rest on every Side: Extend of his Mercies to all People, and fill the World with his Glory.
