Hereby Exhorting both Ministers and People in their several restigious Congregations, With sincere Devotion to give Thanks unto the LORD for his Godness, and Celebrate his Praises for the many inclimable Blessings bestowed upon us.

And in Particular, For the Continuation of the Use of dur most gracious Sobereign Lord tring GEORGE the Second: the Lives of their Royal highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, the Duke, the Issue of the Prince and Princess of Wales, and the rest of the Royal Pamily. That GOD has been pleased to Bless his Majesty's fleets and Armaments With sundry Instances of Clinory and Success. And for his peculiar favours to his people in this Colony: for the Continuation of all our Privileges both Civil and Sacred, and for the Preservation of our Civil and Ecclesialical State and Order. That GOD has been pleased in a time of War, to Protect us on every side so that we have dwelt in safety, and none of our Enemies have may any Invasion upon us, either by Sea or Land.
