HE Smiles of Divine Providence, which Almighty GOD, in various Inflances, has shown to our Nation and Land in the Current Year; His Gracious Appearance for and Remarkable Success granted to His People in their Military Preparations and Enterprizes, His preserving so much Peace and Health in the Land, and crowning the Year with His Goodness, do justly demand and call for our most Humble and Thankful Acknowlegements and Praises, Publickly and Solemnly be made to the Glory and Honour of Him, from whom all Bleffings are derived.

have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of the Council, and at the Delire of the Representatives in General Court Assembled, to appoint, and do hereby appoint Thursday the

Deventh day of November next, to be devouty observed as a day of publick Thanks giving in all the religious Societies in this Colony is dereby Exhorting both Ministers and People in their several Congregations With sincere and hold Joy to acknowlede GDD in all the Ways of his Wercy and Godness, and to celebrate his praises of the Blessugs of his Providence and Grace.

Particularly, for the continuation and preservation of the Life of our most gracious Sovereign sing GEORGE the Second, at home and abroate Of the Lives of their Royal highnesses the three and Princess of Wales, the Duke amost invalinent Dangers, the June of the Princes and Princess of Wales, and the rest of the Royal family; That GDD hath been pleased to give his Beople cause to Respice in dividing so much of the Treasure and Smoot taken from our Enemies at Deople cause to Resoice in dividing so much of the Treasure and Spoil taken from our Enemics at Dea: For GDD's special favours and smiles on New-England, in a series of remarkable Providences appearing on our behalf in the late Expedition, which has been crowned with such figual Uidory and Succels against our Enemies: fre his favours granted to the people of this Colony, in the continuation of our civil and facred Brivileges; for the Benefits and bleffed Effens of the glozious Golpel of CHRIST; The Enjoyment of fo many of the bleffings of Beace in a time of War; and of Dealth in most of our Towns, although some have been victed with Dickness; and for that abundant fupply of the precious fruits of the Earth with which GOD has blessed the Labours of his People in a time of to great Expence.

Together, With fervent Supplications to Almighty GDD, for the KING's Most Fxcellent Majesty, Their Royal Highnesses FREDERICK Prince of Wales, the Princes of Wales, the DUKE, the Princesses, the Issue of the Prince and Princess of Wales, and the rest of the Royal Family: That GOD would direct his Majelty's Councils, succeed his Aegotiations, bless his fleets and Armies, and the Arms of his Allies, protent and prosper the Onke in the important Trust committed to him, put an end to the desolating Calamities of Mar, restore a lasting and honourable Peace to our Nation, and advance the Kingdom of his Son through the whole Earth.
