A PROCLAMATION

For a Day of publick Chanklgiving.

Libo it. bad pleased Almighty GOD to testify his righteous displeasure against an ungrateful People in divers Instances, wherein he hath visited their Sins with the rebukes of his Providence, for which we ought to be Humbled before him; Yet in Judgment he hath remembred Mercy in the currant Year, sor our Nation and Land and hath bestowed on us many great and valuable Blessings: For which it becomes us in the most publick and solemn Manner, to offer up to him our hearty I hanksgivings and Praises.

Bave therefore thought hit, by and with the advice of the Council, and at' the delive of the Representatives, in General Court Assembled, to appoint, and do hereby appoint, that lay the Look Day of November next, to be observed as a day of publick. Thanks iving throughout this Colone; carrelly Exhorting both Hinisters and People in their several religious consergations, with unfeigned Thanks fulness, to bless and magnify the LORD so, all the discovery

ries and exercise of his Godines and Werry.

Particularly, For the toutinuation of the Life of Dur most gracious Sovereign King GEORGE the second, the Lives of Their Royal dighness the Prince and Princes of Wales, the Duke, the life of the Prince and Princes of Wales, and the rest of the Royal Family; and that the Supream Ruler of the Wiorld hath so disposed the hearts of the Potentates of Europe as to enter into a Treaty for letting of Peace among the Nations, which we desire may be perfected to the Honour and Security of the British Nation and its Allies, for that safety and protection which we in times of Danger have enjoyed; For the continuation of our civil and religious Liberties and Privileges. For the preservation of the Life of the Sovernour in his late dangerous Sickness, in a time which so much of the peace and safety of this Colony was dependent thereon; For the blessed Sospel of CHRIST and the gracious Benefits thereof; For so much Health enjoyed and the present abatement of those Sickness divers places have been visited with; For such a competent supply of the Fruits of the Earth, notwithstanding the great Drought which so far prevailed in the Summer past; And so all other Instances of divine Herey and Swoness which SOD hath wen pleased to grant and continue to his People.

Together, With fervent Prayers to Almighty GDD for the KING's Most Excellent Majesty. Their Royal Highnesses FREDERICK Prince of Wales, the Princess of Wales, the Duke, the Princesses, the Tie of the Prince and Princess of Wales, and the rest of the Royal Family: That GDD would direct the United Science of Males, and the rest of the Royal Family: That GDD would direct the United Conjuntaries of Affairs, settle a just and lating PEACE, make way so; and enlarge the peaceable Kingdom of CHRIST, continue to us our Rights and Neberties, bless our Admissistrations, encrease Religion and Learning among us, succedendeadours to Christianize the Heathen and Attach them to the British Interest, prosper us in all our Concerns, direct and enable his People to Trust in the GDD of all their Sabation, and to live agreeable to his Will, and
