ROCLAMATION.

HEREAS the Prefident of the United States of America has been pleafed to transmit to me, in order to be published and made known in this State, bid Proclamation, bearing Date the third Day of October Inflant, "recommending to the * People of the United States, a Day of publick. Thankfgiving and Prayer & which Is live

th Words following, to vit,

Whereas it is the Duty of all Nations to acknowledge the Providence of Alm J. · Gon, to obey his Will, to be grateful for his Benefits, and humbly to implove has · Protection and Favour: And whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their plant Committee, requested me to recommend to the People of the United States, a Day of publick Thankfgiving and Prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful Hearts the many and figual Favoras of Almighty Gon, especially by affording them an Opportunity peaceably to establish a Form of Government for their Safety and

* Now THEREFORE, I do recommend and affign Thursday the twenty-fixth of No-* vember next, to be devoted by the People of these States, to the Service of that egreat and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the Good that was, that is, or that will be: That we may then all unite in rendering unto him our fincere and humble Thanks for his kind Care and Protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation :- for the fignal and manifold Mercies, and the favourable * Interpolitions of his Providence in the Course and Conclusion of the late. War ;--for the great Degree of Tranquillity, Union and Plenty, which we have fince enjoyed :--for the peaceable and rational Manner in which we have been enabled to establish Confir-* traions of Government for our Safety and Happiness, and particularly the national one now lately inflituted;—for the civil and religious Liberty with which we are bleff ed, and the Means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful Knowledge;—and in general, for all the great and various Favours which he hath been pleafed to confer upon us.

 $^{\circ}$ And Also, That we may then unite in most humbly offering our Prayers and S_{UD} plications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations, and befeech him to pardon our national and other Transgressions :--to enable us all, whether in publick or private Stations, to perform our feveral and relative Duties properly and punctually; to render our national Government a Bleffing to all the People, by conflantly being a Govern-' ment of wife, just and constitutional Laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obey-'ed;-to protect and guide all Sovereigns and Nations, (especially such as have thewn 'Kindness unto us) and to bless them with good Government, Peace and Concord;---' to promote the Knowledge and Practice of true Religion and Virtue, and the Increase of Science among them and us; and generally to grant unto all Mankind fuch a ' Degree of temporal Profperity as he alone knows to be best.' As by the faid Proclamation Reference thereunto being had may appear.

I have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice and Confert of the honourable the Privy-Council, to recommend the faid twenty-fixth Day of November next, to be fet apart and observed as a Day of publick Thanksgiving and Prayer, purfuant to the said Proclamation, whereof all the Inhabitants of this State are required to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly-And I do hereby recommend it to the Ministers of the Gospel of every Denomination in this State to perform Divine Service; and to the People committed to their Charge to attend publick Worship on that Day, and to abflain thereon from all fervile Labour and Recreations inconfiftent with the Solemnity of the Festival.
