A P R O C L A M A T I O N for a publick THANKSGIVING.

TPON due Consideration of the undeserved Favours (intermixed with the righteous and corrective Dispensations of Divine Providence) confer'd on this People in the Year past;

Dave thought fit, with the Advice of his Hajelty's Council, and at the Delire of the Assembly in their present Dession, to appoint Thursday the Fourth Day of December next, to be observed as a Day of publick Thanksgiving thro'out this Province, hereby calling upon Ministers and People to celebrate the same, by a debout and thankful Commemoration of the great Goodness of Almighty GDD to a very sinful and apoliatizing people, particularly manifelted in the Preferbation of the precious Life of our Doucreign Lord theking, with the Lives of their Royal Highneffes the Prince of Wales, the Princess Dowager of Wales, the Duke, and the other Branches of the Royal Family, and in returning Dis Majefty in Bealth and Safety to his British Dominions; in Directing His Majesty's Councils and prospering his Administrations for the general Good of the Deople under his happy Government; and in granting, in divers Justances, Success to dis Paiesty's Foxces both by Dea and Land, in their Enterprizes for the securing his Pajety's Dominions and Subjects from the unfult Invalions of their French Meighbours; In continuing to this Province the Enjoyment of their invaluable Privileges, religious and civil; In giving us fo great a Mealure of Bealth, and in keeping off malignant and epidemical Wileales from foreading among us; In affording us to plentiful a parvele as to mole of the Fruits of the Carth, and in remarkably preserving our Navigation in this Time of Danger; With many other unmerited Blessings which require our lincere and thankful Acknowledgements, and our earnest Endeavours that We may thereby he led to an universal Reventance and Reformation: And with our Prailes, to join our united fervent Supplications to the Divine Paicity, who executeth Righteoutiets and Judgment for the Oppresed, That he would graciously appear for Us, to direct and succeed the Consultations and Resolutions of the Government, in relation to the important Unterprizes engaged in for the Protection and Safety of his Majesty's Subjects, and over-rule all our military Operations for the accomplishing of this desirable End: And that it would please DD to hasten the happy Times when the Nations shall learn War no more; but shall universally submit themselves to the righteous Scepter of our vielsed Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST, the Prince of Peace, of the Increase of whose Government and Peace there shall be no End.
