## A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS it hath graciously pleased Almighty God, to bestow signal Victories on his Majesty's Arms, and to defeat the united Efforts of combined Nations, whose Powers, even when separate, have been formidable to all Europe; it becomes us with grateful Hearts to adore the gracious God, to whom alone our Successes are to be attributed: I have therefore thought sit, by and with the Advice of his Majesty's Council, to ordain and appoint, and I do ordain and appoint, that THURSDAY the Twenty-third Day of this Month, be set apart and observed, as a Day of

to Almighty God, for these great and unmerited Mercies: And his Majesty's Subjects are strictly commanded to observe the said Day with the utmost Decency and Reverence, abstaining from all service Labour, and devoutly attending Divine Service; which is hereby directed to be solemnly performed in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of public Worship; of which, previous Notice is to be given, by publishing this Proclamation in the several Congregations.

AND I po recommend to all Ministers of the Gospel, that they offer up devout and fervent Prayers to Almighty God, that these Events may not only prove advantageous to our Nation, but conducive to the Peace and Happiness of Mankind. Yet if Ilis Divine Providence should permit the Ambition of Hostile Powers, to set this desireable Object at a Distance, and foreign Nations continue their Attempts to destroy the British Empire, that He would be pleased to dispose the Minds of all the Sons of Britai to unite their Efforts for the common Sasety.

THAT HE would open the Eyes and cure the Prejudices of the Missed---revive in their Breasts the Love of their Country---teach their kindred Hearts to glow at he Triumphs, animated with an ardent Wish, again to share the Blessings of a Government which all Men admire, but Providence has been kindly pleased to reserve for the Subject of Britain.
