## APROCLAMATION For a general THANKSGIVING.



T having pleafed Almighty GOD, in his wife Providence, to lead the Government of this Province into the Forming and Undertaking of an Expedition against the French Settlements on Cape-Breton, and to incline some of the neighbouring Governments to affish herein; and in a remarkable manner to spirit this People most chearfully to hazard their Lives and Estates in the Service of their KING and Country, as also to dispose our gracious Sovereign seasonably to order a sufficient Naval Force to support and vigorously to

profecute this Expedition, to unite the Land and Sea-Officers in the fame Countels for the common Coufe, to preferve Health both in the Camp and Fleet, and by a wonderful Series of Successes to bring this great Affair to a happy Issue in the Reduction of the City and Fortress of Louisbourg 6, with the Dependencies thereof, to the Obedience of His Majerty with so little Essusion of Blood;

have therefore thought fit, with the Advice of his Pajetry's Council, to appoint Thursday the Eighteenth Day of July Instant to be observed as a Day of publick THANKSGIVING throughout this Province to Almighty GOD, for the Wonderful and gracious Conduct of his Dibine Providence in every Part of this important Enterprize; pereby calling upon Milliters and People religiously to observe the said Day, in devout Expressions of their highest Gratitude to the divine Majesty, for this Infrance of his great Goodness towards a finful and univorting people afteribing the Glory of this memorable Event to the Wildow, Power and Goodneis of GOT, Whose right Hand and both Arm had a caracted. Victory, and charted us to the Places Cour Facmies; and that while to great a Hart of our Strength has been employed in professing this Expedition, SOD has been graciously pleased to protest and preserve both our Sea Coaks and Inland-Frontiers in Safety, so that our Cuemies have been in a remarkable manner referanced from making any Assaults upon us, and with their thankful Praids to join their humble and fervent Supplications to our merciful GDD that he Would preferve and protect his Majesty's lacred Person, and still prosper his Arms for defeating the Deligns of his Enemies and Weakening their power; and that GOD would be pleased to govern the Consequences of this happy Sbent for the future Safety of thele Dis Majefty's Northern-Colonies, and for the Enlargement of the Trade and Navigation of his Pajefty's Subjects both in Great-Britain and America; and that it would please GOD to affect the Bearts of this People With a deep Dense of the divine Soodness, that so they may be thereby led to Repentance and Reformation of those Things that are displeasing in his Sight; and that it would also please GOD to put a speedy and to this destructive War, and advance the glorious and peaceable Kingdom of our Lord and Saviour JESUS CHRIST, and that his pure and holy Actigion may be professed and practiced in those Places Where graven Images have been mossypped; and that the whole Earth may be filled with His Glory. And all service Labour is forbidden on laid Day.

And all Persons whatsoever, especially such as are in civil Authority, are hereby called upon to use their Endeabours that all Disorders undecoming so sacred a Solemnity may be prevented.

Given at the Council-Chamber in Boston, the Eighth Day of July 1745. In the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD of GREAT-BRITAIN, FRANCE and IRTUAND, KING, Defender of the Faith, Go.
