A PROCLAMATION

For a general Thanksgiving.



ORASMUCH as we are under the greatest Obligations duly to observe the various Dispensations of Divine Providence towards us; and more especially with thankful Hearts to acknowledge the many undeferved Bleffings both of a publick and private Nature which GOD is continually conferring upon us; and forasmuch as the Favours and Mercies of the Year past do at this Season require our publick grateful

have therefore thought at, with the Al ... of his Majelip's Council, to order and appoint Thursday the First of November next, to be observed as a Day of publick Thanksgiving thro'out this Province, hereby calling upon both Prinsters and People to solution the same by celebrating the Praises of Almighty GDD so his great Coodness and Bounty bouchsafed to a linful and unworthy People; particularly, in granting unto us a plentiful Parvell in a great Abundance of most of the fruits of the Earth; in continuing peace on our Bolders; in the general health enjoyed in most of the Towns of the Province thro' the Course of the Pear; in protecting our Trade and Ravigation from the Infults of Birates; in directing and succeeding the Administrations of the Sovernment of this Province; and in prolonging our Religious and Civil Uiberties and Priviledges: In preserving the precious Life and Health of our Sovereign Lord the KING, His Royal Higherts the Prince of Wales, and the other Branches of the Royal Family; in succeeding his Bajefty's Counsels for the Continuance of the Peace of Europe : And to join their earnel Supplications to Almighty ODD that thefe and all other Inftances of the Divine Goodnels may have an effectual Influence for working a general Reformation in all Dibers of perfons among us, that fo we may be that happy Beople whole GDD is the LDRT. And all ferbile Labour is forbidden on the laid Day.
