N Consideration of our inditpensable Duty, thankfully to acknowledge the many undeferved Blessings we receive from the Bounty of a gracious GOD, and in a publick manner to manifest our Gratitude for the Divine Favours confer'd upon our Nation and Land, and the whole Church and People of GOD, and more especially, to review the many and signal Mercies of the Year past;
