## A PROCLAMATION.

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this Colony having appointed THURSDAY, the Twenty fixth Day of this Inflant, June, to be objected as a Day of Public THANKSGIVING to ALMIGHTY GOD, for His great Goodness and Mercy, in inclining the Hearts of the BRICE H LEGISLATURE to repeal the late Act of Parliament for having Stany-Duties in America; and requested me to iffue a Proclamation, to make known the fume :



HAVE therefore iffued this PROCLAMATION, and do carneftly call upon, and exhort all His Majefty's Subjects in this Colony, both Ministers and People, religiously to observe the Almignity GOD, by whom Kings reign and Princes decree Juffice, most fincere and bumble Thanks, for His great Goodnets and Mercy, in delivering us from the Calamities with which we were threatened, by inclining the Hearts of the British

Legislature to repeal the late Act of Parliament for levying Stamp-Duties in America; and enter upon other most benevolent and important Measures, which we have Reason to hope will lay a fure I undation for the effectual publishment of our most invaluable Rights, Liberties and privileges; and for a perpetual Union between Great-Britain and her Colonies upon the extensive and permanent Basis of mutual Affection, Harmony, and Interests; and also for the many other Mercies, Divine Goodness is daily indulging us in the Enjoyment of : All which call for the utmost Devotion and Thankfulness to the SUPREME BEING. And I do also earnestly exhort all Persons to offer up their most fineere and servent Prayers to ALMIGHTY GOD, that our manifold Sins and Transgressions may be pardoned; that Piety and true Religion may flourish among us; that he will be pleased to bless our Most Gracious Sovereign King George, and all the Royal Family; that the most fincere and cordial Union, and Affection, fo necessary to the Happiness and Interests of Great-Britain and her Colonies, may forever subsist between them: And that our civil and religious Liberties may be preferred to Us, and continued to the latest Posterity.

AND that the faid Day may be religiously observed, as a Day of public Worship and Thanksgiving, without any Integruption, I do ftrietly inhibit and forbid any fervile Labour to be done thereon, and all Manner of Sports and Pastimes.

GIVEN under my Hand at NEWPORT, this Sixteenth Day of June, in the Year of our LORD One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-fix, and Sixth of the Rign of His Most Sacred Majesty GEOFGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, King of Great-Britain, and fo forth.
