A Proclamation.

HEREAS it is Duty of all Nations to acknowledge the Providence of Almighty GOD, to obey his, Will, to be grated, for his Benefits, and humbly to implore his Protection and Favor: And whereas both Houses of Charles have, by their joint Committee, requested me To recommend to the Bespie of the United States, Day of public Thanksgiving and Prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful Hearts the many and fignal Favors of Almighty GOD, efpecially by affording them an Opportunity peaceable of establish a Form of Government for their Sasety
and Happiness."

NOW THEREFORE, I do recommend and after Thursday the Twenty-fixth Day of November next, to be devoted by the People of these States, to the device of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that will the state will be: That we may then all unite in rendering unto him our fincers and humblathed for his kiel Care and Protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation of the figual of manifold Mercies, and the favourable Interpositions of his Providence in the Course and Conclusion of the late Var;—for the great Degree of Tranquility, Union and Plenty, which we have fince enjoyed;—for the peaceable and rational Manner in which we have been enabled to establish Constitutions of Government for our Safety and Happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted;—for the civil and religious Liberty with which we are blessed, and the Means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful Knowledge;—and in general, for all the great and various Favors which he hath been pleased to confer upon us.

A N D A L S O, That we may then unite in most humbly offering our Prayers and Supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations, and beseech him to pardon our national and other Transgressions;—to enable us all, whether in public or private Stations, to perform our several and relative Duties properly and punctually;—to render our national Government a Blatting to all the People, by constantly being a Government of wise, just and constitutional Laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed;—to protect and guide all Sovereigns and Nations, (especially such as have shown Kindness unto us) and to bless them with good Government, Peace and Concord;—to promote the Knowledge and Practice of true Religion and Virtue, and the Encrease of Science among them and the signal generally, to grant unto all Mankind such a Degree of temporal Prosperity as he alone knows to be best.
