## APROCLAMATION

For a General THANKSGIVING,

Throughout the United-States of AMERICA.

In CONGRESS, November 1, 1777.

ORASMUCH as it is the indispensible Duty of all Men, to adore the superintending Providence of Almighty GOD, to acknowledge with Gratitude their Obligation to Him for Benefits received, and to implore such further Blessings as they stand in Need of; and it having pleased Him, in his abundant Mercy, not only to continue to us the innumerable Bounties of his common Providence; but also to smile upon us, in the Prosecution of a just and necessary WAR, for the Desence and Establishment of our unalienable Rights and Liberties; particularly, in that he hath been pleased in so great a Measure to prosper the Means used for the Support of our Troops, and to crown our Arms with most signal Success:

fet apart THURS DAY, the eighteenth Day of December next, for solemn THANKSGIVING and PRAISE: That at one Time and with one Voice the good People may express the grateful Feelings of their Hearts, and consecrate themselves to the Service of their Divine Benefactor; and that together with their fincere Acknowledgments and Offerings they may join the penitent Confession of their manifold Sins whereby they had forseited every Favour, and their humble and earnest Supplication that GOD, thro' the Merits of Jesus Christ, would mercifully forgive and blot them out of Remembrance; that it may please him graciously to astord his Blessing on the Government of these states respectively, and prosper the public Council of the whole; to inspire our Commanders both by Land and Sea, and all under them, with that Wissom & Fortitude which may render them fit Instruments, under the Providence of Almighty GOD, to secure for these United-States, the greatest of all human Blessings, Independence and Peace; that it may please him to prosper the Trade and Manufactures of the People, and the Labour of the Husbindman, that our Land may yet yield its Increase; to take schools and Seminaries of Education, so necessary for cultivating the Principles of true Liberty, Virtue, and Picty, under his nurturing Hand; and to prosper the Means of Religion for the Promotion and Enlargement of that Kingdom which consistent in Righteousness, Peace, and Joy in the Holy Ghoss.

And is it further recommended, that service Labour and Recreation, altho' at other Times innocent, may be unbecoming the Purpose of this Appointment, be omitted on so solemn an Occasion.
