I have therefore thought fit to cause His Majesty's said Proclamation to be herewith printed, and to appoint *Thursday* the Thirteenth Day of March to be observed and kept as a Day of Public Thanksgiving throughout this Province; and all Servile Labour is strictly forbidden on said Day.

Given at Portsmouth the Twenty-eighth Day of February, One Thousand Seven Hundreds and Sixty, and in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign.

A PROCLAMATION for a Public Thanksgiving.

GEORGE R. E do most devoutly and thankfully acknowledge the great Goodness and Mercy of Almighty GOD, who hath afforded Us his Protection and Affiftance in the just War, in which, for the common Sasety of Our Realms, and for disappointing the boundless Ambition of France, We are now engaged; and hath given such fignal Successes to Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, particularly by the Deseat of the French Army in Canada, and the Taking of Quebec; and who hath most seasonably granted Us at this Time an uncommonly plentiful Harvest: And therefore, duly considering that such great and public Blessings do call for public and solemn Acknowlegments, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this our Royal Proclamation; hereby appointing and commanding, That a General Thanksgiving to Almighty GOD, for these His Mercies, be observed throughout Our Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, upon Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of November next. And, for the better and more religious and orderly solemnizing the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of public Worship, and to take Care for the timely dispersing thereof throughout their respective Dioceses. And We do strictly charge and command, That the said public Day of Thanksgiving be religiously observed by all Our loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty GOD, and upon Pain of suffering such Punishment as We may justly instict upon all such as shall contemn or neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty.

Given at Our Court at Kensington, the Twenty-third Day of October, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty-nine, in the Thirty-third Year of Our Reign.
