A Proclamation for a general THANKSGIVING.

THE many and great Mercies Almighty GOD has of his abundant Goodness, made us the undescreed Subjects of, through the Year past, demand our humble and thankful Acknowledgments, in the most publick and solemn Manner is

HAVE therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of His MAJESTY's Coun-CIL, to order and appoint that Thursday the 24th Day of November next shall L be religiously observed and kept as a Day of Publick THANKSGIVING throughout this Province, hereby exhorting and requiring both Ministers and People, fincerely to folemnize the same, devoting a reasonable Part of said Day to Fublick Worship in their respective Congregations, -- with thankful and obedient Hearts, to offer up our united Praises to the Most High GOD--- That in the midst of Judgment, in the afflicting Dispensation of Providence, by the Death of her Royal Highness the Princess Louisa, remembering Mercy; hath been most graciously pleased to preserve the inestimable Life of our Sovereign Lord King GEORGE---Our gracious Queen CHARLOTTE--- Their Royal Highnesses George Prince of Walles--the Princess Dowager of Wales, and all the Royal Family--- That we have the 2 Continuance of Peace, together with our civil and facred Privileges--- That we have been blessed with a plentiful HARVEST---For Preservation from infectious and calamitous Distempers, and that we have enjoy'd such a Measure of Health in our Habitations, which with many other Blessings, daily bestowed on us, by our Great Benefactor, should excite our most fervent Zeal for his Glory; carnestly beseching we may be impress'd with a due Sense of all his Mercies: That our Hearts may be unfeignedly thankful, and that we may show forth his Praise, not only with our Lips, but in our Lives, by giving up ourselves to his Service, and walking in Heliness and Righteousness all our Days.
