For that it hath pleased him mercitally to sentinue the precious Lives and Health, of our gracious Sovereign Lord King GEORGE, our gracious Queen CHARLE LOTTE, His Royal Highness GEORGE Prince of Wales, and all the Royal Family.

That we have been preserv'd from infectious sickness and wasting Calamities.

For the Continuance of general Peace, and the Blessings of civil & sacred Society.
