## A Proclamation for a public Thanksgiving.

ORASMUCH as We are under indispensible Obligations of Duty and Gratitude to bless and magnify the great Name of Almighty GOD, for the innumerable Instances of Divine Goodness vouchased to us in the Course of the present Year,

I HAVE therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of His MAJESTY's COUNCIL, to order and Appoint, that Thursday the Nineteenth Instant, be observed and kept as a Day of Public THANKSGIVING throughout this Province, to Celebrate the High Praises of Our GRFAF PRESERVER and BOUNTIFUL BENEFACTOR, for prolonging the Life of Our Sovereign Lord King GEORGE the Third, and his Royal Confort our most gracious Queen CHARLOTTE, their Royal Highnesses George Prince of Wales, the Princess Dowager of Wales, and all the Branches of their illustricus Family; for the Tranquility of Furope, especially in the Kingdoms of Great-Britain and Ireland; for the Peace, Plenty, and general Health enjoyed throughout this Province and Land; for the Continuance of our Civil and Feelesiastical Privileges; and all the other numberless and unmeritted Favors and Blessings afforded unto us.

And all servile Labour is forbidden on the said Day.

GIVEN at the Council Chamber at Portsmouth, this 3A Day of Newember 1767, in the Eighth Year of the Reign of Our Sovercign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the FAITH, &c.
