HAVE therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of his Majesty's Council to order and appoint Thursday the Twenty-Fifth of this Instant November, to be religiously observed and kept as a Day of public Thanksgiving throughout this Province; hereby exhorting both Ministers and People to devote a reasonable Part of said Day in Praises and Thanksgivings to GOD for all his manifold Mercies confered on us, and especially that it hath pleased him mercifully to continue the Lives and Health of our gracious Sovereign Lord King GEORGE, our gracious Queen CHARLOTTE, His royal Highness GEORGE PRINCE of WALES, and all the royal Family.

That the Employments of our Fields and Commerce have been prospered.

That contagious Sickness and destroying Calamities have been witheld from our Habitations, which are mercifully preserved in much Health, Safety and Peace.

That we are blest with the Preservation of our civil and sacred Rights and Priveleges: Wherefore let us most humbly glorify the Author and Giver of all Good; devoutly imploring his divine Influences upon us, to pour into our Hearts such Love towards GOD, that we loving him above all Things, may obtain the Promises which exceed all that we can desire.

And all Servile LABOR is strictly forbidden on said Day.
