Young Men's Christian Association is thriving. SUPERBLY EQUIPPED Work has expanded rapidly from its introduction—reaches Many Men Daily.

The main entrance opens into a large lobby two stories high with corridors overlooking the reception room where the reading and correspondence rooms are located.

During the two years the new building has occupied 122 men who occupied rooms for a considerable period.

Even the educational classes, employment bureau, social and other features are held in the building.

The association was organized in 1885 with D. D. Johnson as first president and secretary.

In 1893 A. C. Bridgman became secretary and the association entered upon an era of increased activity.

The association took on new life and in a few years entered a new era and it became evident that the ground required a large modern building with complete equipment.

The present general secretary, came to Columbia September 1, 1914, and supervised the construction of the building and has supervised the activities of the association.

The success of the association is due to the soundness of the management and the interest of the members.

GREAT DISPLAY FOR STATE FAIR

"Panama" Spectacle Will Be Elaborately Staged. SHOW OF FIREWORKS Pyrotechnic Feature Added Yesterday to Offerings in Columbia From October 26 to 30.

One of the new features of the South Carolina State fair this year will be Gordon's display of fireworks. The fair will be held in Columbia October 26 to 30.

"Panama" will be one of the largest fireworks shows ever presented in the South and will be seen for four nights on the grounds which the fair is in progress.

J. Saunders Gordon, president of the company offering the spectacle, arrived in Columbia yesterday for a conference with the State fair officials.

There will be 300 costumed performers in the spectacle, sixty pounds of dynamite and a display of 15,000 square feet of oil painted scenery.

"Panama" is a picture of the workings of the inter-oceanic canal, the greatest of the modern achievements of the world.

The first act of "Panama" the canal appears on the opening scene with the first of the great ships, foreign diplomats and army regiments.

Following "Panama" a display of fireworks will be shown in the afternoon and evening.
